The Santana Riders show in July was attended by Sophie, Larissa, Rosalee and Danae. It was hot (my truck said it was 103 when we were leaving!), but our riders all stayed cool and did an outstanding job. Larissa went pretty much undefeated except for one second place finish-behind Sophie and Jasper!

We are planning on a Dressage Clinic to be held at ECEC with Elizabeth Johnson on August 30, starting bright and early at 8am. It's always nice to get instruction from somebody who isn't your trainer- and even I am going to join in and take a lesson!

Some changes are headed our way too. In September, ECEC will start feeding hay cubes instead of the regular hay our horses get right now. This will help cut down on the amount of

waste and mess our horses can make, and ensure the horses are getting the right amounts of feed. We will start to transition the horses by feeding both hay and cubes, then the hay will start to trickle off, and hay cubes will be left.

As far as the schedule goes, I don't think we will have any interruptions to lessons except for the Poway show being held in the afternoon; we will cancel any lessons that begin after noon, and maybe some of the morning if horses can't be switched for lessons.

Class info

Walk/Trot Division - Open to riders of all ages. Riders may not cross-enter into any other divisions.*
Crossrail Division - Open to riders of all ages. Fences not higher than 1'0". Riders may not cross enter into other jumping class. Flat classes allowed. **
Short Stirrup Division - Over fences class course of fences up to 2'. Open to all riders 12 & under.
Long Stirrup Division - Over fences class course of fences up to 2'. Open to riders 13-17 and adult amateurs 18 & over.
Hunter Hack Classes - Riders work collectively on the flat and then one at a time will jump a line. After jumping the line they may be asked to demonstrate control by extending the canter down the long side of the arena to a halt and rein back 3 steps.
Prettiest Pony - Riders will lead his/her horse or pony into the arena by bridle or halter and with no saddle. Prize will be given to the cleanest horse/pony
Sit-a-Buck - Riders will be asked to walk, trot, and canter bareback while holding a \$1 bill under his or her calf. Last rider to hold the \$1 will win all of the fallen dollars from the other riders, plus PVRA will match all of the fallen dollars and add to the cash prize. Each rider provides his/her own \$1.
Handy Hunters - Riders will jump over a course that includes bending lines, trot fences, etc.
3-Bar Knockdown - Riders will jump over a line of three fences with height increasing after each clear round. Riders will be eliminated as soon as a pole from the last fence in the line is knocked down. Max height in first round is 2'3".

Appropriate show attire: Riding boots and ASTM/SEI helmets and English saddle required.
 Parent or guardian must sign consent form for riders under 18 years of age. Ribbons 1st-10th
 Only PVRA members are eligible for PVRA Year-End High Point Awards.
 Points are accumulated for one horse/same rider combination.
 CLASSES WITH FEWER THAN THREE ENTRIES
 ARE SUBJECT TO CANCELLATION.
